### Esteemed Lecturing Knight, Clint Tompkins

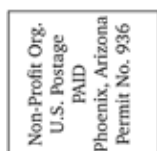
March is a month of transition, marking the arrival of spring and symbolizing new beginnings.


