



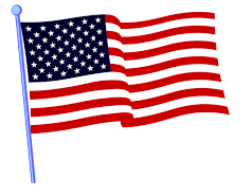

While volunteering at a Homeless Veteran Outreach Event through the FOCUS Grant we received from Grand Lodge, working alongside Community Bridges, U.S. Vets, and other partners—we witnessed a heartbreaking reality that



is impossible to forget. So many of our veterans are experiencing homelessness, hunger, and personal need deprivation. How can this be? These are the very people who once stood ready to give their lives to protect us while we went about our daily routines. Some served in combat; others worked behind desks, providing the

essential support that made missions possible. But all served with courage, and many continue to bear the invisible wounds of that service.

I've seen veterans at the VA who step nervously out of line when they hear footsteps behind them, unsure if the sound is friend or foe. I have a friend who must be spoken to before she's approached from behind, because a simple, unexpected touch can trigger a collapse to the floor.

How is it that these same heroes now sleep on the ground, clutching a wagon or suitcase that holds everything they own? How is it that so many lack food, water, or a place to shower?

Yes, some choose this life for reasons we may never know, but many others wish only to wake up in a warm bed, brew a cup of coffee, and feel safe again. The image of that single wagon from that day has been permanently etched in my mind, and I hope now in yours, as a symbol of what we must continue to fight against. When you see a veteran, thank them. Offer them water, food, or a small act of kindness. Volunteer when you can. They stood for us and it cost them so much, sometimes everything.

If you cannot give, be respectful. Be grateful.

And always, remember the wagon. Remember the veteran.

She also chairs the Applications Committee, is a key part of the alcohol inventory crew, and continues to be one of our most active and dependable members.

Proclamation

WHEREAS, the Red Ribbon campaign was established by Congress in 1988 to encourage a drug-free lifestyle and to promote involvement in drug prevention and reduction efforts; and
WHEREAS, the Arizona National Guard's Counterdrug Task Force has been nationally recognized for the State of Arizona's drug demand reduction program; and
WHEREAS, I established the Stopping Arizona's Fentanyl Epidemic (SAFE) initiative to strengthen drug interdiction efforts with the Arizona National Guard Counterdrug Task Force to prevent illicit drugs, such as fentanyl, from entering Arizona communities. The initiative also allocates additional resources to help decrease fatal opioid overdoses in the state; and
WHEREAS, through Executive Order 2025-01, I established Operation Desert Guardian (ODG), Arizona's initiative to disrupt transnational criminal organizations trafficking illicit drugs in communities, reduce drug demand, and ensure community safety; and
WHEREAS, Red Ribbon Week is celebrated every year during the period of October 23 through October 31 by State Governors, the National Family Partnership, parent-teacher associations, Boys and Girls Clubs of America, the Young Marines, the Department of Defense, the National Guard Bureau, the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA), and hundreds of other organizations throughout the United States; and
WHEREAS, Phoenix Elks Lodge No. 335 proudly supports Red Ribbon Week through volunteer efforts, educational outreach, and youth contests designed to inspire young people to live drug-free; and
WHEREAS, the Red Ribbon Campaign is a national effort to honor the memory of Enrique (Kiki) Camarena, a federal narcotics agent and former marine veteran who was murdered by drug traffickers in 1985, and to engage communities and educate youth about substance use.
NOW, THEREFORE, I, Katie Hobbs, Governor of the State of Arizona, do hereby proclaim October 23-31, 2025, as
