

How is it that these same heroes now sleep on the ground, clutching a wagon or suitcase that holds everything they own? How is it that so many lack food, water, or a place to shower?

Yes, some choose this life for reasons we may never know, but many others wish only to wake up in a warm bed, brew a cup of coffee, and feel safe again. The image of that single wagon from that day has been permanently etched in my mind, and I hope now in yours, as a symbol of what we must continue to fight against.

When you see a veteran, thank them. Offer them water, food, or a small act of kindness. Volunteer when you can. They stood for us and it cost them so much, sometimes everything.

If you cannot give, be respectful. Be grateful. And always, remember the wagon. Remember the veter-


